WHAT'S BEING DONE?

Dakota County is leading the construction of the Robert Street Pedestrian Tunnel and Trail Connections project. This will provide a safe, grade separated connection for pedestrians crossing the busy Robert Street corridor.

The new segment of the River to River Regional Greenway is from Livingston Avenue to the Wentworth Library including trail facilities, an underpass crossing at South Robert Street, and the relocation of a portion of Crawford Drive. A grade-separated crossing of Robert Street along the River to River Regional Greenway provides the best trail user experience and accommodates the widest range of potential regional trail users.

WHEN WILL WORK TAKE PLACE?

Work is tentatively scheduled to begin with single lanes on Robert Street Monday August 17, 2020. Traffic will continue to use Robert Street throughout construction but delays should be expected.

Utility companies will begin relocating some of their facilities. The Contractor will begin with removals.

This year the Contractor will be working on the east half of the project, including the underpass and the trail to Wentworth. The project will continue next Spring with the west half.

WHAT SHOULD I EXPECT?

Work will include trail construction and paving, utility adjustments and finally installation of a pedestrian tunnel under Robert Street. The new underpass will include signage, lighting and plantings surrounding the trail. As part of this project, Crawford Drive will be realigned to improve connections to the trail and underpass. Robert Street will remain open to local traffic throughout construction. However, delays are expected. For the safety of both the residents and the workers, please be patient.
